

BMSSS is the social concern and development wing of the Catholic Archdiocese of Bangalore. Established in the year 1969 and registered under Karnataka Societies Registration Act 1960 (Reg. No. 117/69-70). BMSSS is a secular, non-governmental, not-for-profit organization for the uplift of the marginalized Women, Children, Youth, Farmers, the Sick and the Suffering. The organization works especially for the development of Dalits and Minorities. BMSSS is registered under 12A and 80G under income tax department. It is also registered with NITI AYOG and Ministry of Home Affairs of the Government of India.

OPERATIONAL AREA

Geographical area of Catholic Archdiocese of Bangalore is the operational area of BMSSS. The Archdiocese of Bangalore has jurisdiction over the districts of Bangalore Urban, Bangalore Rural, Tumkur, Kolar, Ramanagara, and Chikballapur in Karnataka state.


DEVELOPMENT APPROACH

"The purpose of human life is to serve, to show compassion and the will to help others", said Albert Schweitzer-the writer, theologian and Nobel Peace prize winner in 1952.

With the support of Catholic Relief Services (CRS) of the United States of America (USA), Food distribution program was one of the major charitable activities of BMSSS in the first two decades of its existence. The program covered all the remote and undeveloped areas of the Archdiocese of Bangalore.

BMSSS started functioning with charitable activities. The approach of the organization shifted from charity to integrated development with a priority for women empowerment. From the year 2005 onwards, BMSSS began to focus on networking with other NGOs and partnering with donors in implementing various development programs with emphasis on Rights Based Approach (RBA) in all programs and activities.





Housing For The Marginalized

Location: Kolar Gold Fields [KGF] in Kolar district Supported by Catholic Bishops' Conference of Italy (CEI)

Kolar Gold Fields [KGF] – a centrally owned gold mine was closed in 2003 and many of its workers became jobless with no proper income for their families. Closing of the mines affected the ordinary workers in a severe way. They were compelled to leave their families in utter poverty. They were given Government quarters as residences which they found difficult to maintain with no source of income. As a result, the houses got dilapidated and were in need of urgent renovation of roof, floors and walls of the houses.

In 2019, Catholic Bishops' Conference of Italy decided to support the house renovation. The project of house renovation was expected to be implemented in two years. Kolar Gold Fields (KGF) was the needy location for housing renovation as it was an area with many marginalized families with very low income. The parish priests of KGF & BMSSS Staff identified the needy households for house renovation and submitted the list to BMSSS. After processing the applications and identifying the low-income households for house renovation work, an efficient local contractor was identified and given the task of renovating the houses. The contractor for house renovation work had many challenges on his way of executing the job. However, the work yielded fruit in completing House renovation work of 20 Beneficiaries.

Location: Districts of Bangalore Archdiocese Supported by Kolping India, Chennai

In collaboration with Kolping India, the project was started previously to form Self-Help Groups (SHGs) of women in all parts of the Archdiocese of Bangalore. Initially, the project was implemented to improve both the spiritual and economic conditions of members of women SHGs. The objective of the project was to enhance capacity of women through activities as members of SHGs throughout the Archdiocese of Bangalore. The project was implemented in 58 Villages with 1510 households. 1469 beneficiaries of the project consisted of Christians, Muslims and Hindus. They were able to access 21 Govt. schemes after training.

The income is very useful for the family maintenance and medical expenditure. This income has supported her to stop the practice of borrowing loans from outside.

SAMALOCHANE project was implemented in collaboration with Archdiocesan Board of Education (ABE). The project was executed by visiting schools by our project staff. They used instruction modules in consultation with National Institute for Mental Health & Neuro-surgery (NIMHANS). They took classes for students on discipline, time management, awareness on suicide prevention, relationship, effective communication, stress management, adolescent period, anxiety disorder, substance abuse, personality development, problem solving, decision making and peer pressure. Other features of the project included motivational classes for teenagers, Counselling for parents, personal counselling of some students, essay & drawing competitions for children and system establishment. 2800 students attended 54 motivational classes during the year. 2100 parents were counselled on handling properly parent-child relationship in consultation with professional counsellors from NIMHANS and SAMPURNA.

The main objective of all activities of the project was 'Suicide Prevention among Teenage Students'.

Disability does not stop you from living a happy life

Miss. Vijayakumari, is 22 years old, the eldest daughter among 3 daughters of Rama Reddy and Eshwaramma, residing in Kolar district, Mulbagal taluk, Rajendrahalli Panchayath, Byaadrahalli village. Daily wages are the financial support for their living. She dropped out from school and decided to open a small provision store in her village for her livelihood. She opened a provision store on 25-09-18 and was earning the amount equal to the daily wages of her parents. She became a backbone of her family. Miss. Vijayakumari was attacked by polio and both her legs



affected. She completed her S.S.L.C and wanted to continue her studies for which she had to travel every day from her village to Mulbagal town. This was very difficult for her. The Pension was stopped abruptly. The CBR project, B.M.S.S.S staff Mrs. Nagamani and Mr. Gopi guided and informed her about the CBR project and helped her to make U.D.I.D card. Mrs. Nagamani also facilitated her to get pension regularly which was stopped due to some reasons. Now due to the continued support and guidance from CBR team she initiated a V.D.P.O with 10 members and she is the secretary of the group. She is now leading an independent life and supports her family. Vijayakumari is living a respectful life in the society and became an inspiring role—model for other physically challenged people.

Cancer Campaign

A project to raise Awareness, Early Detection, Treatment and Prevention of Cancer

Location: Bangalore Archdiocese Supported by Caritas India, New Delhi

The campaign with funding support from Caritas India is planned for 18 months starting from November 2019. The campaign initiative specially aims at promoting local volunteers to take forward remedial action against the spread of cancer and also mobilize resources locally from the general public, church institutions and other donors who share the same commitment to deal with cancer and treat people who suffer from cancer. The purpose of the campaign is not only to prevent cancer and care for cancer patients but also build a health based social capital in the Archdiocese. Enterpreneurship Traning for Women

Location: Kolar Gold Fields [KGF] in Kolar district Supported by Manos Unidas, Spain

Entrepreneurship Development Training and Revolving Fund are the two main components of the project. After the training, the trained women are facilitated to access bank loans for starting entrepreneurship. It often happens that women are inclined to abandon their small businesses as soon as they complete the repayment of bank loans. Hence the priority is to adequately prepare the rural women to manage and stabilize their entrepreneurial activities. BMSSS aims at utilizing the revolving fund from Manos Unidas to strengthen the individual as well as the group entrepreneurial activities to improve the capacity of women to earn a better income for their families. As we realize that development process is time consuming, we intend to use the revolving fund component of the project to sustain the entrepreneurial activities of the economically backward semi-literate rural women.


